Mary's relative Elizabeth becomes pregnant at the same time.

Jesus is born in Bethlehem to Mary, and Elizabeth's son is called John.

About 30 years later, Jesus begins his work. He is baptised by John and he calls 12 others to be his disciples.

He teaches (e.g. the Sermon on the Mount and parables)

and performs miracles (e.g. the Wedding at Cana and healing the blind man).

But Jesus makes enemies among the religious leaders.

The disciples recognise that Jesus is the Messiah, and Jesus gives the keys to Peter.

At the Last Supper, Jesus shares a final meal with the disciples.

He is arrested, tried and crucified. While on the cross, Jesus asks John to care for Mary, his mother.

On the third day, Jesus is resurrected and later ascends to heaven.

The disciples receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.
